Those who caused the harm gain empathy and understanding—not only for those directly affected, but for others who were impacted by their actions such as family, friends and coworkers. Then those who have harmed have a chance to make amends and shed the "offender" label, ultimately breaking the cycles of misbehavior and disruption.
