ABOUT GENCEN

The Center for Gender in Global Context is an interdisciplinary center in International Studies & Programs focused on gender, feminist, and women's studies. Its affiliated faculty and students study how women and men from diverse racial, ethnic, national, and sexual backgrounds live in and engage with the world and how processes of global change affect gender relations locally, nationally, and internationally. Working in conjunction with the academic colleges, the center promotes outstanding undergraduate and graduate education, facilitates research and scholarship of the highest caliber, and undertakes innovative outreach and active learning initiatives.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The graduate specialization in Women's & Gender Studies is an elective addition to master's and doctoral degree programs at MSU. Once admitted to their chosen department, students may enroll in this program. Jointly sponsored by the Colleges of Arts & Letters, Education, and Social Science, the specialization is designed to provide opportunities for graduate students to obtain a comprehensive, cross/interdisciplinary academic experience in women and gender and to foster the growth of interdisciplinary research and teaching on women and gender. Emphasis is given to understanding the diversity of women's lives nationally and globally.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

The graduate specialization is open to graduate students with adequate undergraduate preparation in women and gender. Graduate students interested in enrolling in the specialization should contact the Center for Gender in Global Context.

Individual programs are designed with the GenCen Advisor. Students must complete:

- 1. One core course (3 credits)
 - WS 897: Seminar in Feminist Theories, Epistomologies, & Pedagogy
- 2. Elective courses (9 credits)

Elective courses must focus on women's and gender issues and should complement the student's major interests. At least one of these courses must be at the 800-level. A complete list of applicable courses is maintained by the GenCen Advisor.

With the approval of the advisor, courses that are used to satisfy requirements in the student's graduate degree program may also be used to satisfy the requirements for the Graduate Specialization in Women's & Gender Studies.

Upon completing the requirements for the Graduate Specialization in Women's & Gender Studies, the student should contact the advisor and request certification for the completion of the specialization. After the certification is approved, the Office of the Registrar will enter the specialization on the student's academic record and the date that it was completed. This certification will appear on the student's transcript.
