- WS 403 (Women and Change in Developing Countries), 3 credits
- WS 493 (Internship), 2-4 credits

Students will be required to enroll in a minimum of six credits, in any combination of the courses offered. (SSC 493 will be pass/fail and SSC 496 will be graded.)
