WS 201: Intro to Women's Studies

This is an introductory course to the Women's and Gender Studies program. Students will gain a foundational knowledge of theories and methods in women's and gender studies and of women's experience historically and across the globe.

WS 202: Intro to Contemporary Feminisms

This course examines theories of feminism and gender from a variety of intersectional perspectives. Students will gain a working knowledge of feminist theories, vocabulary, and of the history of Western feminism.

WS 304: LGBTQ Studies

This course introduces students to the history, politics, theories, science, cultures, and communities of lesbian, gay, transgender, queer, and intersex people including a global perspective.

WS 404: Women in the Law w/ Ingham County Clerk Barb Byrum

WS 404 will be taught by Ingham County Clerk Barb Byrum. This course will examine the law in the United States as a vehicle for structuring and maintaining women's social roles, and for social change.
