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

The Graduate Specialization in International Development is available as an elective for students who are enrolled in master's and doctoral degree programs at Michigan State University. The specialization, administered by the College of Social Science, is designed to:

- Provide an opportunity for graduate students to obtain a comprehensive and contemporary academic experience in the field of international development;
- Sensitize graduate students with an interest in development studies to their professional obligations and responsibilities; and
- •Develop an intellectual envrionment that will foster the growth of research and teaching in the area of development studies.
- •Examine continuity and change around the globe by considering political ecology, migration, education, social and cultural norms, policy, geography, gender, and globalization.



# Master's of Arts or Master's of Science (4713)

- •Two of the core courses for 6 credits

  \*Recommended: CSUS/ANP/FOR/PLS/SOC 826
- •Two additional courses with substantial international development content for 6 credits
  - \*Courses not on core list require advisor approval
- •At least half of the total GSID courses must come from outside of the student's major
- •Maximum of one 400-level course

## Doctoral Program (4714)

- •Two of the core courses for 6 credits \*Recommended: CSUS/ANP/FOR/PLS/SOC 826
- •Four additional courses with substantial international development content for 12 credits
  - \*Courses not on core list require advisor approval
- Incorporate issues of international development relevant to student's program of study in the departmental comprehensive exam
- •Maximum of one 400-level course
