

SUMMER TEACHING FELLOWSHIP

Call for Applications for Graduate Students Interested in Teaching Summer WS Courses

The Center for Gender in Global Context (GenCen) will be hiring advanced PhD graduate students as instructors for Summer 2020 to teach core courses WS 201, WS 202, WS 301, WS 304, WS 351, and WS 403. These courses will be taught online only. Students applying to teach must be doctoral students engaged in some aspect of women's and gender studies.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS OF APPLICANTS

- Previous degree in Women's and Gender Studies
- Enrollment in or completion of graduate specialization: Gender, Justice, and Environmental Change (GJEC); Women's and Gender Studies (WGS); or International Development (GSID)
- Previous teaching experience
- Women's and Gender Studies coursework completed

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- A cover letter expressing the student's interest and experience in and qualifications for teaching a specified course
- A sample syllabus for the course you would like to teach (see gencen.msu.edu/grad-funding for sample syllabi)
- A current C.V. that lists all relevant coursework completed
- A letter of support from the student's major advisor
- 1-2 paragraph teaching philosophy



Instructors will be selected by a sub-committee of the GenCen Curriculum Committee and will be notified of selection by March 2, 2020. Awards are contingent upon funds approval and funding will first be applied to any outstanding MSU bills, including MSU short-term loans, tuition bills, etc. Fellowship recipients cannot receive more than the equivalent of a one-quarter time assistantship from other sources during the semester in which they receive the award.
