# DISSERTATION RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP (UP TO \$10,000)

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

Ph.D. students at MSU who have completed all requirements for their degree with the exception of their dissertation research. Applicants must have dissertation projects that incorporate a focus on the gender dimensions of environmental and/or agricultural change. A copy of the approved departmental dissertation proposal must be received by GenCen prior to disbursement of funding.

### APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Completed Application Form with Research Budget Itemization
- Five-page (double-spaced) Summary of the Dissertation Proposal
- Letter of Recommendation from Dissertation Committee Chair
- Curriculum Vitae

# DISSERTATION COMPLETION FELLOWSHIP (UP TO \$8,500)

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

Ph.D. students at MSU who have completed dissertation research and all other requirements for their degree program, except for completion of the dissertation. Applicants must graduate by the end of Fall 2022 with a dissertation that is focused on the gender dimensions of environmental and/or agricultural change. A copy of the approved departmental dissertation proposal must be received by GenCen prior to disbursement of funding.

### **APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS**

- Completed Application Form
- Five-page (double-spaced) Summary of the Dissertation Research
- Letter of Recommendation from Dissertation Committee Chair
- Curriculum Vitae

Awards are contingent upon funds approval and funding will first be applied to any outstanding MSU bills, including MSU short-term loans, tuition bills, etc. Fellowship recipients cannot receive more than the equivalent of a one-quarter time assistantship from other sources during the semester in which they receive the award.
