LGBTQ & Sexuality Studies at MSU

The Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer (LGBTQ) & Sexuality Studies Minor is available to students enrolled in Bachelor's degree programs at MSU. This minor provides the opportunity to obtain a comprehensive, global, cross/interdisciplinary academic experience in sexualities, gender identity and expression, and queer identities and activism. The minor complements a wide range of majors and is especially suited for students who plan to work with or advocate for issues of diversity, inclusion, and cross-cultural understandings.

Students who wish to pursue the minor must contact the GenCen Advisor to arrange an appropriate course of study; courses must be approved by the advisor to ensure adequate LGBTQ Studies content. Due to the dynamic and interdisciplinary nature of our programs, it is important to meet regularly with the advisor to stay up-to-date on course/other opportunities.

With the approval of the department/college that administer the student's degree program, courses that are used to meet the requirements for the minor might also be used to satisfy the requirements for their degree.

Study Abroad

Students have the opportunity to complete up to 60% of the minor's program requirements with the "Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity & Sexual Politics in Amsterdam" summer abroad program.
